### Prizes

Rosettes will be awarded to each section winner.

### Special Prizes

The Sandy Cumming Memorial Trophy, sponsored by RBST Caledonian, will be awarded to the best bird from a breed listed on the RBST Poultry Breeds at Risk Register.

Other perpetual prizes, trophies and any special prizes relating to a specific class are detailed with that class.

### Rules

1. The show will open for entries at noon on **Friday 18th September 2020**. All entries must be completed via the Festival website by midnight on **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> October 2020**. No late entries will be accepted.
2. All classes are held under the general rules and conditions of the Festival.
3. All birds entered in the Festival's show must be the bone fide property of the exhibitor and must have been in their ownership since 1<sup>st</sup> October 2020.
4. No bird may compete in more than one class unless specifically stated in the class description and a bird may only be exhibited in the class appropriate to it
5. All entries are final and cannot be amended after submission.
6. Egg classes are included in the Garden, Craft and Kitchen competition, which can also be entered on our website at [www.ssgf.uk](http://www.ssgf.uk).
7. In the event of there being more birds entered than can be accommodated, the organisers reserve the right to require exhibitors to make a proportionate reduction in the number of entries.
8. In the event of any class having fewer than three entries, the organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes. This will be at the discretion of the Steward, after discussion with the Judge.
9. Photographs must not include the name of the exhibitor, any previous prizes, rosettes, awards, prize tickets, or anything else that may identify the exhibitor.
10. No birds may be shown with open rings
11. The Judge may disqualify any exhibit fraudulently dealt with or any person he deems guilty of dishonorable conduct.
12. The appointed judging panel members will complete judging before the 24th October.
13. **All winners will be notified via email by 11am on the 24<sup>th</sup> October.**
14. Any protests must be lodged with the Organiser **via email**, before 5pm on the day of the Festival. The Organisers reserve the right to settle all protests or disputes that may arise and that decision is final.

## Photograph guidance notes for all classes

Every entry should include 4 photographs, taken in landscape format:

1. Full bird, side-on
2. Legs & Feet
3. Open wing
4. Head (showing eye, comb, wattles, beak etc)
